Full-time, degree-seeking students participating in majors of Construction Management, Construction Science, Building Construction, or related courses of study are urged to apply for this opportunity. Retail Contractors Scholarship will provide you with the tools to enhance your undergraduate education, setting you apart from your peers.

### What is the RCA?

The Retail Contractors Association (RCA) is a national organization of high caliber retail contractor united to provide a solid foundation of ethics, quality, and professionalism within the retail construction industry. RCA's mission is to promote professionalism and integrity in retail construction through industry leadership in education, information exchange, and jobsite safety.

The RCA Scholarship Program was established in 1997 to recognize top construction management students. Scholarships are funded by donations from RCA members.

### Application Process

Scholarship awards for the 2023 cycle will be \$3,000 each

Be selected as a finalist by your school/department

Complete the RCA Scholarship application form with supporting documents

Completed applications must be received by the RCA January 31, 2023

Selection and award process will be completed by February 28, 2023

### Qualifications

- Be an undergraduate student of Construction Science, Construction Management, Building Construction, Construction Technology, or similar academic discipline at an accredited university or college.
- Be a United States Citizen.
- Be enrolled as a full-time student and enrolled in a minimum of 12 semester credit hours (or equivalent quarter hours) during the time scholarship assistance is received (Fall 2023).
- Demonstrate a declared interest in pursuing a career in commercial construction following graduation.
- Be in good standing when selected; good academic standing is defined as a 3.25 GPA in the major and a 3.0 GPA overall.
